The Presentation

The congregation is seated. All Vergers present gather at the communion rail.

The Rector then addresses the congregation:

Rector

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ, we are baptized by one Spirit into one Body and given gifts for a variety of ministries for the common good and the edification of the Church. We are here to commission [Insert Candidate(s) Name(s)] as a Verger in the Name of God and of this Parish. He / She has responded to a noble calling to serve in this signal manner, and will hereafter take his place among the various ministries of our congregation. We accordingly raise up this particular ministry of the laity to the Body of Christ in the Church universal and do hereby recognize and acclaim this ministry to the Gospel of Our Lord in the daily life of [Insert the name of your Parish]

Role of a Verger

Since the early days of the church, lay persons have been commissioned to assist the Clergy in the Divine Liturgy. The position of Verger first evolved in medieval England where a man served as "Protector of the Procession". He led and protected the Clergy, Deans or Bishops as they processed within the precincts of the church or cathedral. As a sign of liturgical authority vested in his Office, the Verger carried a large mace known as a "Virge". The Virge was often used to dissuade animals or unruly people from disrupting the procession. Vestiges of this tradition still exist throughout the Anglican Communion as Vergers leading processions and in the wand or staff they carry as a sign of their Office. Today the Verger serves as a lay assistant to the rector, helping to both oversee the preparations for church services and manage physical aspects of the service.

The candidate is then presented to the Rector and the congregation.

The Examination:

The Rector and Head Verger now examine the candidate(s):

Rector: Will you tend this House of God with reverence and care, and will you endeavor to see that the forms of worship are conducted in conformity with the Canon Laws of the Anglican Church in North America, the rubrics of The Book of Common Prayer, and the customs of this congregation?

Candidate(s): I will in the name of Christ our Lord and to the glory of God the Father.

The Rector then addresses the whole congregation:

Rector – to the congregation

People: We will

Rector - to all the Vergers and Candidates:

Vergers and Candidate(s) here gathered, do not be negligent, for the Lord has chosen you to stand in His presence, to minister to Him, and to be His minister.

Candidate and all Vergers present: I am your servant, Lord. Grant me humility that I may know your decrees.

Rector: Let us pray.

The Commissioning

The Rector now commissions the candidate:

Vergers' Certificate
